The 26th Governing Council Meeting was held on 9th November 2017.



ADDRESS BY THE CHAIRMAN

The Chairman welcomed all the members of the Governing Council and sought for their co-operation in all the activities. On a motion sponsored by the Chairman, the following resolutions were adopted by the Governing Council.

The following points were discussed,

ACADEMICS:

1. To reopen the college for the II Year students on 10th December 2018 and III Year students on 18th December 2018 and for the I Year students on 18th January 2019.
2. The Budget for the academic year 2019-20 was proposed for approval and the Academic schedule for the even semester to be decided.
3. To start an additional course in the UG stream, B Tech - Information Technology and in the PG stream, M Tech - Bio Technology.
4. To conduct Parents Teachers meeting after the publication of University Results during the first week of September 2018.
5. November /December 2017 results after reevaluation were submitted as follows.

11. Mentors of I Year students would be the same till the completion of their course

12. Event Management Clubs would be formed to take care of all event organisations

13. To adopt modern teaching methodologies and enable self-learning through NPTEL and MOOC

14. Grievance Redressal mechanism with reference to Hostel, Academic and other facilities are received from all the stakeholders including students and parents and various committees are constituted to rectify the problems at the earliest. The committee also ensures that the problems are rectified

15. The following vocational courses were applied

- * Food Processing

16 Playground levelling has been done.

17. With reference to the Travel Grants for staff attending International Conference abroad, two faculty have been approved for the foreign Travel Grant.
